Personal and Family Information:

Rowland was born 20th February, 1893, Oxted, Surrey, and baptised in St. Mary's Church, Oxted, 9th April, 1893. He was the son of Alfred Woodgate and Elizabeth Humphrey of Godstone and Oxted respectively, they married in St. John the Baptist Church, Oakwood, 10th June 1882.

The family moved from Oxted to Horsmonden in the mid 1890's, living at Caple Manor Gardens where Alfred worked as a gardener for the Austen family home at Capel Manor.

Rowland's mother Elizabeth died in Horsmonden in 1899 when Rowland was just 6 years of age. His father Alfred married Rosa Baxfield on the 25th Aug 1900 at St. Mary's Church, Stoke Newington.

Prior Occupation: Rowland followed his father's footsteps and in 1911 was working as a gardener, aged 18, for the Morley family at their estate, Hall Place, in Leigh, Kent.

Relevant Military Record/Service details:

Service Records: Rowland's attestment and service files were badly damaged in September 1940, when the Army repository in Arnside Street, Walworth, London, was hit by a German incendiary bomb. The millions of WW1 service records stored there were badly damaged by fire and further damaged by the water used to extinguish the blaze.

The remains of these records were photographed and eventually digitised and made available online, even though much of the material is illegible.

From the damaged pages of Rowland's records, it is possible to trace much of his military history.

Rowland was attested in Tonbridge (att.1) and joined the 7th battalion, Royal West Kents on 4th September 1914. He served at Home for almost a year before landing with the British Expeditionary Force in France on 26th July 1914.



Service Attestation

He was wounded in the November of 1915, by a gunshot wound to the knee, the record with "ser." added, which probably means the wound was serious. He was shipped home for treatment before re-joining his unit at the end of August 1916. In October 1916, Rowland received another gunshot wound to the right leg and was shipped back to England on board the hospital ship HMHS "Gloucester Castle".






Then in March 1917 he embarked on the transport ship "Royal George" from Devonport and disembarked at Basra, Iraq, before joining his unit on the 27th May 1917, as a part of the ill-fated Mesopotamia Expeditionary Force.






Rowland was admitted to hospital in October 1918 with influenza and during this stay in hospital he died of cellulitis, probably due to a head injury becoming infected. The report on the right below simply says "Died of disease, (cellulitis, head.")

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Rowland was buried in Baghdad (North Gate) Military Cemetery.


Sadly, like the other Commonwealth War Grave Cemeteries throughout Iraq, the North Gate Cemetery has been a victim of neglect and vandalism.

The CWG did manage to complete certain renovations in 2012 but the photograph of the cemetery (further on page 9 of this information sheet) from 2014 shows much more is required.

The CWG remain fully committed and will eventually repair and maintain these sites when the situation in Iraq allows.

In the meantime, they have books of remembrance available for public viewing at their HQ in Maidenhead.



The signed claim form for Rowland's plaque and commemorative scroll was witnessed by H. Smith-Marriott, Horsmonden Rector and Clerk of holy Orders.

Soldiers Effects:

Rowland's personal possessions included: disc - purse - 2 Threepenny pieces - photos - postcards - wallet - diary - Christmas card - letters - cap badge - cigarette case — papers and letter cover. Rowland's father received the package with his personal possessions.

Dependent's Pension: Alfred was awarded a dependents pension.

The original pension award card has not as yet been found so the weekly amount is unknown.

The Pension Card below, shows that it was altered in 1938 following Alfred's death.

Alfred's name and address have been crossed out with notes saying that he was deceased and his last address was at Edenbridge, Kent.

The note underneath reads "step-mother E" which indicates that the pension payments had been transferred to Alfred's wife, at 2, Perryfields, Marlpit Hill, Edenbridge.

The "E" was Eleanor (nee Tepper) Woodgate.

Rosa, Alfred's second wife had died after a long illness on the 9th February 1932 at the Poplars Nursing Home, Horsmonden and Alfred, aged 70, married Eleanor in the 4th quarter of the same year.


